Survey construction

1. There are many items that are double loaded. In cases where questions are asking two or more ideas in one question, you can't interpret the response.

Ex Learning experiences in FCPS about identity and bias happen as often as they should

2. Institutional racism is often experienced as a series of institutional barriers to opportunities.... In the context of curriculum, institutional barriers in accessing learning, engagement, teaching

You may want to consider add a few questions about institutional barriers

- 3. Race and Racism are used in a manner that suggests these ideas are interchangeable, I would reconsider using these terms in that way... we can talk about race without involving racism
- 4. Also, having these discussions can be about our aspirations. I wonder if there is a way to query about that.

Last, these ideas are not offered as an invitation to increase the number of questions. I think you can consider which questions you might want to remove. What counsel have you received on the appropriate number of questions?

Let me know if meeting with a member of the team would be the easiest way to discuss these items. This work is shaping nicely!!!
